



Waggener Edstrom Worldwide is an international public relations and marketing company with major clients that include Microsoft.

Occupying two floors in downtown Bellevue, WA, their existing ten-year-old space was dark, heavily-colored and maze-like, blocked natural daylight and views, and impeded the employee's ability to communicate and collaborate.

Our reconstruction of the space removed meaningless interior walls, opening the space to light and views. The new work station system featured 42-inch high side panels with 14" glass extensions, allowing privacy when seated, but communication when standing, contributing to the feeling of openness and collaboration.

Complementing the open work environment, multiple conference rooms ranging in size from small to large allow for private phone calls, team meetings and formal client presentations. Chance meeting are encouraged at kitchen and break areas, copy areas, and in the main corridors, where white boards and flat screen monitors support collaborative work.

The space is deliberately clean and simple to act as a neutral canvas for the display of Waggener Edstrom's own work.
