

McMillan LLP, a Canadian business law firm with international offices, engaged IA to design their Ottawa, Vancouver, and Toronto offices totalling over 160,000 square feet. Consistent, key project goals included maximized efficiency and creating local culture for each regional office within their existing design standards in order to have a "one office feel" globally.

Each project began with a workplace strategy effort, including keep/toss/create activities with leaders from various departments. Once buildings were selected via IA's test-fits and building evaluation services, the design team programmed each to determine the number of glass-front universal offices, workstations, adjacencies, meeting spaces, amenities, and collaboration zones required. Compact planning and multifunctional spaces resulted in increased spatial efficiency, while also allowing for future growth.

While client centres—board and conference rooms—are selfcontained within a primary security layer, staff collaboration and lounge zones are central to the office plans. Boosting culture and talent recruitment, spaces atypical for law offices were also integrated, including a collaboration area versus a library, lounge style meeting areas with integrated technology, and a multi-purpose lunchroom with a ping-pong table.
